Whether you are a visitor or joining us online or coming home to All Saints, we welcome you this morning.


Although we gather to mourn our loss, we also gather to celebrate Tom's new life in the household of our loving Father.

May you, as Tom did, know God's presence and His peace in this place.




THE HOLY COMMUNION

Through Jesus Christ our Lord; who rose victorious from the dead, and comforts us with the blessed hope of everlasting life. For to your faithful people, O Lord, life is changed, not ended; and when our mortal body lies in death, there is prepared for us a dwelling place eternal in the heavens. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

The People stand or kneel. The Celebrant continues

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.










THE COMMUNION OF THE FAITHFUL







Post-communion Prayer





IN MEMORIAM THOMAS CARROLL, JR.



Thomas Carroll, Jr. was born on May 12, 1934 in Brooklyn, New York to Alvetta and Thomas Carroll, Sr. He was raised alongside his younger sister, Alvetta "Brenda," who was constantly at his heels, and with whom a close and lasting bond was formed.

Tom attended Franklin K. Lane High School. After graduating, he attended the School of Dentistry at Brooklyn College. He was drafted by the United States Army and was sent to Fort Dix, New Jersey for basic training, after which, he was transferred to Paris, France where he served his enlistment. Tom retired from service in the U.S. Army Reserve in 1994.

During his time spent in the Army, he met Jeanine Moss. They married and a few years after the birth of their daughter, Letticia Estelle (Tina Marie), the family moved from their flat in Bedford Stuyvesant to their current home in Bayside, Queens. The Carroll home was always active and welcoming to children, grandparents, aunts and uncles, cousins, friends from the past, newfound friends, as well as many newly adopted members of the Carroll family. There was also a huge array of family pets that provided Tom with gentle comfort and enjoyment, even in his final years.

Tom became a police officer within the Housing Authority, and later joined the NYC Fire Department and was assigned to HazMat. It was this HazMat crew that was the first on-site at the World Trade Center on 9-11. And it is where Tom established new commitments and friendships that have endured a lifetime He treasured many moments of bonding with this extended family – usually lighthearted, but too often, filled with somber times of injury and sometimes loss of fellow firefighters. Tom served the NYFD faithfully for 28 years until his retirement in 1993.

Tom loved to spend time at home with his family where music was always present. He danced to the oldies and tried to keep up with whatever was the new genre. He adored most the impromptu duets of Jeanine and Tina, singing and playing favorites at Christmas and Easter, or whenever the mood struck. He also enjoyed and frequented classical performances at Carnegie Hall. And in later years, he cherished being present to see his grandson's saxophone performance at a jazz showcase in the Village.

When Tom became a grandfather to Taylor, he discovered a new buddy and traveled frequently to Chicago, where he was a regular fixture at classroom presentations and at every sporting event, whatever the season...soccer, basketball, track or cross country. If Taylor was involved, wherever it was, Tom was there.

The common thread through all points of Tom's life has been his love of the Lord, Jesus Christ his Saviour. The love and care he extended to -- and received from -- his church family at All Saints Episcopal Church, was his binding stitch.

Thomas Carroll, Jr. entered into larger life on January 9, 2022. He is survived by his wife Jeanine, daughter Tina, son-in-law Jeffrey Dugas Sr., grandson Taylor Jeffrey Dugas, sister, Brenda Scott and brother-in-law, Neil Scott. He also leaves sisters-in-law, nieces, nephews and a host of extended family and close friends.
