Opening Sentences

All standing, the Celebrant says Alleluia! Christ is risen! People The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia!

The Celebrant then continues There is one Body and one Spirit; People There is one hope in God's call to us; Celebrant One Lord, one Faith, one Baptism; People One God and Father of all. Celebrant The Lord be with you. People And also with you. Celebrant Let us pray.

The Collect of the Day: Grant, O merciful God, that your Church, being gathered together in unity by your Holy Spirit, may show forth your power among all peoples, to the glory of your Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*

The Collect of the Day:

Celebrant The Lord be with you. *People* And also with you Celebrant Let us pray.

Almighty God, you have given your only Son to be for us a sacrifice for sin, and also an example of godly life: Give us grace to receive thankfully the fruits of his redeeming work, and to follow daily in the blessed steps of his most holy life; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

The First Lesson

Now a new king arose over Egypt, who did not know Joseph. He said to his people, "Look, the Israelite people are more numerous and more powerful than we. Come, let us deal shrewdly with them, or they will increase and, in the event of war, join our enemies and fight against us and escape from the land." Therefore they set taskmasters over them to oppress them with forced labor. They built supply cities, Pithom and Rameses, for Pharaoh. But the more they were oppressed, the more they multiplied and spread, so that

Exodus 1:8-2:10

the Egyptians came to dread the Israelites. The Egyptians became ruthless in imposing tasks on the Israelites, and made their lives bitter with hard service in mortar and brick and in every kind of field labor. They were ruthless in all the tasks they imposed that on them. The king of Egypt said to the Hebrew midwives, one of whom was named Shiphrah and the other Puah, "When you act as midwives to the Hebrew women, and see them on the birthstool, if it is a boy, kill him; but if it is a girl, she shall live." But the midwives

feared God; they did not do as the king of Egypt commanded them, but they let the boys live. So the king of Egypt summoned the midwives and said to them, "Why have you done this, and allowed the boys to live?" The midwives said to Pharaoh, "Because the Hebrew women are not like the Egyptian women; for they are vigorous and give birth before the midwife comes to them." So God dealt well with the midwives; and the people multiplied and became very strong. And because the midwives feared God, he gave them families. Then Pharaoh commanded all his people, "Every boy that is born to the Hebrews you shall throw into the Nile, but you shall let every girl live."

Now a man from the house of Levi went and married a Levite woman. The woman conceived and bore a son; and when she saw that he was a fine baby, she hid him three months. When she could hide him no longer she got a papyrus basket for him, and plastered it with bitumen and pitch; she put the child in it and placed it among the reeds on the bank of the river. His sister stood at a distance, to see what would happen him. to The daughter of Pharaoh came down to bathe at the river, while her attendants walked beside the river. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her maid to bring it. When she opened it, she saw the child. He was crying, and she took pity on him, "This must be one of the Hebrews' children," she said. Then his sister said to Pharaoh's daughter, "Shall I go and get you a nurse from the Hebrew women to nurse the child for you?" Pharaoh's daughter said to her, "Yes." So the girl went and called the child's mother. Pharaoh's daughter said to her, "Take this child and nurse it for me, and I will give you your wages." So the woman took the child and nursed it. When the child grew up, she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter, and she took him as her son. She named him Moses, "because," she said, "I drew him out of the water."

The Second Lesson

I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God- what is good and acceptable and perfect.

For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as

Romans 12:1-8


in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.







Presentation and Examination of the Candidate

The Celebrant says The Candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

Sponsors I present Ella Rose Cooper to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

The Celebrant asks the parents and godparents Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life? Parents and Godparents I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ? Parents and Godparents I will, with God's help.

Then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the candidates who can speak for themselves and of the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the infants and younger children

Question Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God? Answer I renounce them. *Question* Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God? *Answer* I renounce them.

- *Question* Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God? *Answer* I renounce them.
- *Question* Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior? *Answer* I do.
- *Question* Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love? Answer I do.
- *Question* Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord? *Answer* I do.
- After all have been presented, the Celebrant addresses the congregation, saying: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Ella in her life in Christ?

People We will.

The Celebrant then says Let us join with Ella whom we commit to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

The Baptismal Covenant

- *Celebrant* Do you believe in God the Father? *People* I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
- Celebrant Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

- Celebrant Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread,and in the prayers ?People I will, with God's help.
- Celebrant Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord? <u>People</u> I will, with God's help.
- Celebrant Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ? People I will, with God's help.



Celebrant Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself? People I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being? People I will, with God's help.

The Prayers for the Candidates

The Celebrant then says to the congregation:

Let us now pray for Ella who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth

A Person or persons appointed lead(s) the following petitions.
Leader Deliver Ella, O Lord, from the way of sin and death. People Lord, hear our prayer.
Leader Open her heart to your grace and truth. People Lord, hear our prayer.
Leader Fill her with your holy and life-giving Spirit. People Lord, hear our prayer.
Leader Keep Ella in the faith and communion of your holy Church. People Lord, hear our prayer.
Leader Teach her to love others in the power of the Spirit. People Lord, hear our prayer.
Leader Send her into the world in witness to your love. People Lord, hear our prayer.
Leader Bring Ella to the fullness of your peace and glory.

People Lord, hear our prayer.

The Celebrant says Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever. *Amen.*

Thanksgiving over the Water

The Celebrant blesses the water, first saying The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give him thanks and praise.

Celebrant

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water.

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. *Amen.*





The Baptism

The candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant, who then pours water upon, the candidate, saying

Ella Rose, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Then the Bishop or Priest places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross with Chrism

Ella, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own forever. Amen.

Celebrant Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain her, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. *Amen.*

When all have been baptized, the Celebrant says Let us welcome the newly baptized.

Celebrant and People We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

The Baptizand may be given a taper lit from the paschal candle with these or similar words: Receive this candle as a reminder that you are to be a bearer of the light of Christ in the world.




Post-Communion Prayer After Communion, the Celebrant says, Let us pray together:
