

The First Reading

It happened in the days of Herod the king that the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a city of Galilee, called Nazareth, to a maiden named Mary who was betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the family of David.

The angel appeared to her and said, "Hail, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women." When Mary saw the angel, she was startled at what he had said, and wondered to herself what this greeting could mean.

The Angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. You are to have a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He shall be great and shall be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God shall give to him the throne of his forefather, David. He shall rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there shall be no end."

Then Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, seeing I have no husband?"

The angel answered and said to her, "The Holy Spirit shall come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you so that the child that is born shall be called holy, the Son of God."

Mary said, "I am the servant of the Lord. Let it be as you have said." And the angel departed from her.

The Second Reading

And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the city of Nazareth, in Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, for he was of the house and lineage of David, to be taxed with Mary, his betrothed wife, who was soon to have a child.

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the Prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son.




