Renewal of Ordination Vows and of Commitment to Ministry

Bishop Provenzano My brother, you have been called by God to work as a pastor, priest, and teacher, together with your bishop and fellow presbyters, and to take your share in the councils of the Church. On this anniversary of your ordination I ask, Will you continue to proclaim by word and deed, the Gospel of Jesus Christ? *Fr. Byrne:* I will, with God's help.

Bishop Provenzano Will you continue to fashion your life in accordance with its precepts?

Bishop Provenzano: Will you continue to love and serve the people among whom you work, caring alike for young and old, strong and weak, rich and poor?

Fr. Byrne: I will, with God's help..

Bishop Provenzano Will you continue to preach, to declare God's forgiveness to penitent sinners, to pronounce God's blessing, to share in the administration of Holy Baptism and in the celebrations of the mysteries of Christ's Body and Blood, and to perform the other ministrations entrusted to you?

Fr. Byrne: I will, with God's help.

Bishop Provenzano Will you continue to nourish Christ's people from the riches of his grace, and strengthen them to glorify God in this life and the life to come?

Fr. Byrne: I will, with God's help.



The Wardens address the Bishop saying: Bishop, we have come together today to celebrate the twentieth anniversary of Father Byrne's ministry among us and to reaffirm our commitment to work together as priest and people for the building up of the Body of Christ.

Bishop Provenzano: Larry, you have led this parish church since 2005. Do you, in the presence of this congregation, reaffirm your commitment to serve the people of this parish as their Rector?

Fr. Byrne: I do with gladness and singleness of heart.

Bishop Provenzano: Will all of you gathered continue to support your Rector and his family in their ministry?

Bishop Provenzano: Will you together continue to make All Saints a community with hearts open to God, minds open to possibilities, and doors open to all?

Bishop Provenzano: Let us pray for your Rector and for the life and ministry of this parish church.

That by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit he may be sustained and encouraged to persevere to the end,
we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear our prayer.*

For his family, and for this parish family, that they may be adorned with all Christian virtues,
we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear our prayer.*

For the mission of All Saints and of the whole Church, that in faithful witness it may preach the Gospel to
the ends of the earth, we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear our prayer.*

For the peace of the world, that divisions may cease a spirit of respect and forbearance may grow among
nations and peoples, we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear our prayer.*

For those in positions of public trust, that they may serve justice and promote the dignity and freedom of
every person, we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear our prayer.*

For a blessing upon all human labor, and for the right use of the riches of creation, that the world may be
freed from poverty, famine, and disaster, we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear our prayer.*

For the poor, the persecuted, the sick, and all who suffer; especially those who suffer from food insecurity
from gun violence, and from bigotry; for refugees, prisoners, and all who are in danger; that they may be
relieved and protected, we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear our prayer.*

For ourselves; for the forgiveness of our sins, and for the grace of the Holy Spirit to amend our lives, we
pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear our prayer.*

For all who have died in the communion of your Church, and those whose faith is known to you alone,
that, with all the saints, they may have rest in that place where there is no pain or grief, but life eternal,
we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear our prayer.*

Rejoicing in the fellowship of the ever-blessed Virgin Mary, and all the saints, let us commend ourselves
and all our life to Christ our God. *To you, O Lord, our God*

The Bishop adds a concluding collect Everliving God, strengthen and sustain Larry that with patience and
understanding he may continue to love and care for your people; and grant that together they may follow
Jesus Christ, offering to you their gifts and talents; through him who lives and reigns with you and the
Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

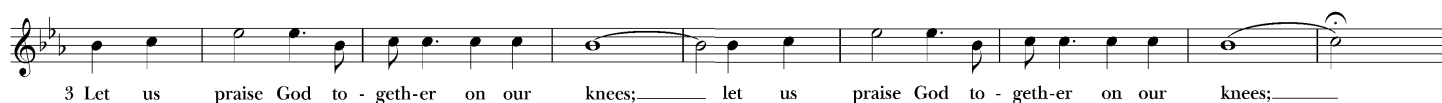
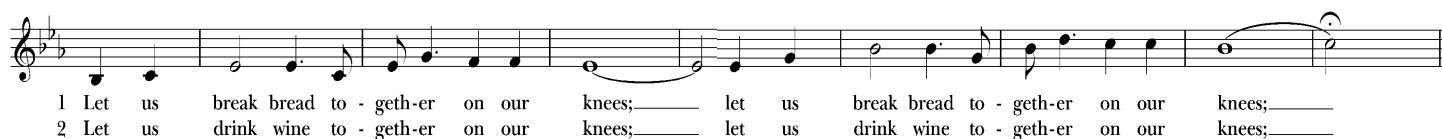
THE COMMUNION OF THE FAITHFUL

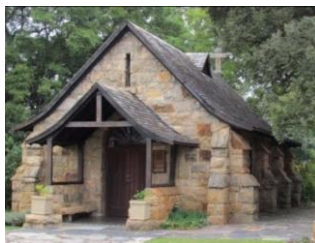
